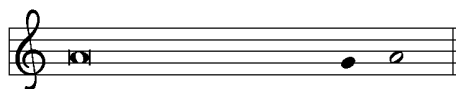

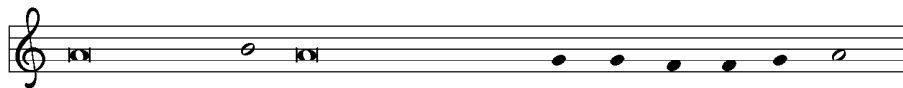

But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, ⁷even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, ⁹but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰Therefore I am content with

weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.




DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

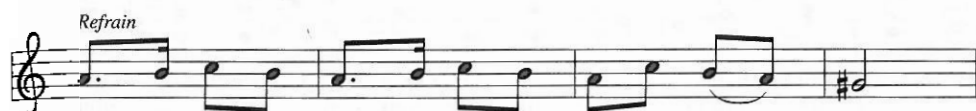

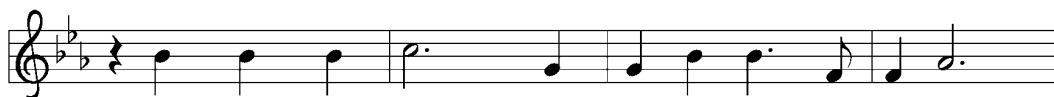

God's Work, Our Hands... Phinney's Ministry in Christ's Name



While our media is full of doom and gloom economic reporting, it can be hard to remember what this looks like in the lives of actual people. This special section of the Sunday bulletin is set aside to share a specific story of economic distress. We hope this will help our church community better understand these difficult times and craft a more informed plan to assist those in need.

When I met Mark, he asked me if the church would buy him some shoes. I wasn't sure about his need for footwear, but he lifted up his bare soles and showed me caked on dirt about a quarter of an inch thick. I knew someone in our office offered to secure Mark footwear before, and he had declined because they weren't the right ones. I brought up this incident, and he got frustrated and left. I saw him again a few days later, and we had more of a chance to talk. Mark had lived with his wife in the country near Issaquah for many years. In 2001, an accident hindered his sight and he wasn't able to continue working at a high level of construction. Glasses which helped correct the problem caused debilitating migraines, and weren't an option. As time wore on, his wife left and he lost his house. Living on the streets, he needed to walk everywhere in order to stay alive. His feet are quite large and cheaper shoes wear out quickly for him. We found a pair that will last, and the shoe clerk gave us a discount after hearing some of Mark's story. Mark is confident he can return to work as a manual laborer, and perhaps find a niche in the industry that will work with his level of vision. Please keep Mark and our community's many vulnerable people in your prayers.
