Above is the financial picture for the congregation for January-April. This is an unusually high deficit for this point in the calendar year. At the May Church Council meeting the council came to agreement on several bold steps to reverse this negative cash flow trend. The four step process includes the following:

1. Request that the staff prepare a budget reduction proposal and immediately begin reducing expenses.
2. Form a task force of council members and staff to prepare a plan for further, more serious reductions, to be approved at the June Council meeting.
3. Reach out to the congregation to keep them informed of the needs of the church and keep them updated on the progress of the council's efforts.
4. Continue to encourage regular, faithful giving, particularly through the leaner summer months.

In spite of the economic downturn which began over two years ago, we have continued to be faithful stewards of all that we have been given. As the recession continues to affect more and more members here, we as leaders look to those who are able to continue or increase their strong support so that our witness to Christ may remain strong as well.

This year I have watched you all grow in stature and grace as you allowed me to participate more fully in your lives. You have encouraged me, rejoiced with me, held me in your prayers, and we have imagined together and talked over hopes for the future. I am so grateful for your encouraging words and endless hoping. I think of your stories and rejoice. I smile as I think of running with you on the front lawn, holding you when you cried or singing along with you during the liturgy. You sang, “All Are Welcome,” and you meant it! I hear your words of encouragement echoing deep down, where they have taken root in my heart. You genuinely desire to care for every life you touch.
